PASTOR'S

A word from the Pastor

"But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you" (Matthew 6:33, NKJV).

HAPPY NEW YEAR!! The beginning of a New Year has always been special to me because it reminds me that a new beginning is always possible. The things of the past don't have to hold the same importance because something new is on the horizon.

I think back to the time I was in art class in elementary school. I would be trying to draw a picture, I'd make a mistake, erase, make another mistake, erase. I learned quickly that I could only erase so many times before the paper didn't look so good anymore. There would be a lot of smudge marks and I would become so frustrated because the picture I was trying to create was marred by all my past errors. Seeing my distress, my art teacher came over, took my paper and gave me a brand-new sheet of paper to draw on. She told me, "Don't worry about what was on the page I took. You now have a brand-new piece of paper. Create something new with joy!"

Our old year with our past mistakes is now behind us. We have a New Year to create something new with joy! To create something new we really do have to let go of our less than stellar performance in the past. That being the case, what would you like to do now? What do you want to create differently this year? Maybe you want to create a new set of priorities for your life. Your life has been good, but you want to "kick it up a notch." You want to grow in your faith walk and pick up some new habits while letting go of those things that don't matter to you anymore.

Setting priorities in our life, or rearranging our priorities, can be a great thing to do at the beginning of the year. Jesus even helps us in the development of our priorities by focusing our attention on our first priority. The verse at the top of page one comes from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount found in Matthew chapters 5 through 7. Here Jesus directs us to, "Seek first the kingdom of God..." This means centering our lives on a relationship with God through Christ. When we place God first it becomes easier to bring our other priorities in line.

Some ways we can seek God first include, making Sunday worship a priority, making time for morning devotions a priority, making time for private and public prayer, engaging in Bible and Christian book studies, along with other opportunities that present themselves. As a means of encouraging daily Bible reading, I have included a 52-week Bible Reading Plan in this edition of The Messenger. I used this plan last year and found it a great guide to get through the Bible in a year and to read different sections each day.

The first three Sundays in this New Year my messages will be focusing on priorities. We will look at our number one priority, developing priorities, and living priorities. We will also be participating in a Wesley Covenant Renewal Service on the first Sunday, followed by Holy Communion. This is an opportunity to focus and center our lives in relationship to Christ. Then, as we move through the first part of the year, we will study the Apostles' Creed during our morning worship. This will offer us the opportunity to delve into a greater understanding of what we believe. Again, with the intent of focusing our lives more and more on Christ.

Yes, the New Year offers us new opportunities to grow and be transformed more and more into the image and likeness of Christ. Our old ways can be exchanged for new ways that will propel us forward in our love for the Lord and our love for one another.

May this New year be filled with hope and blessing! God is good! All the time!
